After Word War II during which he was wounded four times and shell-shocked twice, Nicholas Burlak completed his higher education in Germany and the Ukraine. He became a dramatist and musical director producing variety shows which were staged throughout the USSR and Latin America. Now a resident of the US, he continues to write and appears publicly performing his nonfiction stories for American audiences.
